### Advising Requirement

Advising is mandatory for this program. Consult your department advisor or program coordinator for information.

### E-advising Tools

Students are encouraged to use the interactive e-advising tools that have been designed to help them graduate within four years. These tools can be accessed through the Student Center.

The Bachelor of Arts in Music comprises a core of courses intended to give students a comprehensive understanding of music theory, history, ear training, keyboard proficiencies, and technologies.

**The option in applied music.** Students, in consultation with their major advisor, develop a more wide-ranging course of study including music composition, jazz studies, performance, and more.

**The option in music education.** This is a comprehensive program for students planning careers in music education for grades K-12. This program is in preparation for the Single Subject Credential in Music. Through hands-on experiential learning students develop musicianship, conducting, and teaching skills in a variety of settings including general, elementary, choral, and instrumental. Students study a variety of instruments including how to play them and how to teach future students to play the instruments. They participate in ensembles (instrumental and choral) as well as private studio instruction. They learn about teaching through the application of pedagogical practices and theories that prepare them for their future career.

## Grading Requirement

All courses taken to fulfill program course requirements must be taken for a letter grade except those courses specified by the department as credit/no credit grading only.

For those courses taken for a letter grade, students must earn a grade of C- or higher.

<sup>1</sup> Students wishing to do a recital must have completed two units of upper-division studio instruction.<sup>2</sup> MUSC 110 and MUSC 310 may be repeated for credit.

## Special Music Requirements

1. Advising is required each semester for all music students.
2. Incoming students who wish to articulate units from another institution in theory, aural musicianship, or beginning piano classes must take the Placement Exam in those curriculum areas. Students who wish to receive units as "credit only" in the curricular areas listed above must take the Challenge Exam in those areas. (For students that believe they have the necessary skills and do not need to take

the class in question). Students may only take the Challenge Exam for a class in a semester where they are already enrolled in that class. Consult with the department office with any questions.

3. Students wishing to be enrolled as a music major should contact the advisor in the option in which they are interested. The advisor will help you determine if your choice of major/option is appropriate. Consult the department website to locate the advisor of the option or contact the department office with any questions.
4. It is strongly suggested that students enrolled in studio instruction (MUSC 110/310) be concurrently enrolled in a performance ensemble (MUSC 411, 412, 413). Students who have completed their requirements in studio instruction **MUST** be concurrently enrolled in an ensemble to be qualified for additional studio instruction units.

The second major-designated Writing course is the Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GW) (EO 665 (<https://calstate.policystat.com/policy/9585618/latest/>)). Students must earn a C- or higher to receive GW credit. The GE Written Communication (A2) (<https://catalog.csuchico.edu/colleges-departments/undergraduate-education-academic-success/general-education/#A2>) requirement must be completed before a student is permitted to register for a GW course.
