## MUSC 101 Theory I 3 Units

**Prerequisite:** Open to Music majors and minors only, or by department permission.

**Typically Offered:** Fall only

Fundamental concepts and basic notation of music. Introduction to chord symbols, voice leading, part writing, harmonic progression, and basic principals of form. 3 hours discussion. (005935)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 102 Theory II 3 Units

**Prerequisite:** MUSC 101 with a grade of C- or higher. Open to Music majors and minors only, or by department permission.

**Typically Offered:** Spring only

Further study of voice leading, part writing, and principals of form. Introduction to chromaticism and modulation. 3 hours discussion. (005936)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 103 Aural Musicianship I 1 Unit

**Prerequisite:** Open to Music majors and minors only, or by department permission.

**Typically Offered:** Fall only

Development of listening skills through sightsinging and dictation. 2 hours activity. (005954)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 1 unit

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 104 Aural Musicianship II 1 Unit

**Prerequisite:** MUSC 103 with a grade of C- or higher. Open to Music majors and minors only, or by department permission.

**Typically Offered:** Spring only

Further development of listening skills through sightsinging and dictation. 2 hours activity. (005955)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 1 unit

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 105 Beginning Piano I 1 Unit

**Prerequisite:** Open to Music majors and minors only, or by department permission.

**Typically Offered:** Fall only

Development of elementary piano techniques, including basic hand position, music reading skills, transposition, harmonization and improvisation, including the Primary chords and Dominant seventh chords, and playing solo and ensemble literature. 2 hours activity. (005976)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 1 unit

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 106 Beginning Piano II 1 Unit

**Prerequisite:** MUSC 105 with a grade of C- or higher. Open to Music majors and minors only, or by department permission.

**Typically Offered:** Spring only

Continuation of developing beginning piano techniques and fundamentals of music, including sight-reading, transposition, harmonization and improvisation, and playing more advanced solo and ensemble literature. 2 hours activity. (005977)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 1 unit

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 108 Computer Software for Musicians 3 Units

**Typically Offered:** Fall only

This course teaches a comprehensive and foundational overview of the tools for modern music creation, education, and distribution. 3 hours lecture. (005978)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 109 Introduction to Music Technology 3 Units

**Typically Offered:** Spring only

Theory and practice of sound recording, including audio theory and the use of computers, microphones, recording consoles, and digital audio workstations. 3 hours discussion. (006072)

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## MUSC 110A Studio Instruction in Applied Music: Brass 1 Unit

**Prerequisite:** Department permission by audition.

**Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

MUSC 110A - MUSC 110G: Specialized individual instruction for music majors in their major performing media. A weekly private lesson. Study of technique, music literature, and problems of performance. A jury examination is required each semester. Students who perform in a departmental recital may be excused from the jury at the discretion of the instructor. 3 hours supervision. (005987)
