REAL 301 Principles of Real Estate Prerequisite: ECON 102, ECON 103. Tunically Offered: Foll and paring 3 Units

Typically Offered: Fall and spring

A comprehensive study designed to give students a good understanding of marketing forces affecting real estate. Subject matter introduces the student to legal, socioeconomic, and environmental factors related to the real estate industry. The course examines such areas as (1) the economic characteristics of real estate resources and the basic factors influencing the supply and demand for real estate; (2) national, state, and local influences on real estate markets, including demographic trends; (3) land ownership and conveyance, financing and marketing real property; and (4) managerial review of marketing practices. 3 hours lecture. (008112) **Grade Basis:** Graded

Repeatability: You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units **Course Attributes:** Upper Division

REAL 389 Intern/Cooperative Education

1-3 Units

Prerequisite: Senior standing, faculty permission. **Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

This course is an internship. You must register directly with a supervising faculty member. For students who wish to gain practical work experience with participating firms/organizations. This course enables a student to study policy, control, and decision-making in a specialized work environment. See advisor for student's performance requirements, assignments, and methods of evaluation prior to undertaking the internship. 9 hours supervision. (008116)

Repeatability: You may take this course for a maximum of 15 units **Course Attributes:** Upper Division

REAL 398 Special Topics

1-3 Units

Prerequisite: Department permission. **Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

This course is for special topics. Typically the topic is offered on a onetime-only basis and may vary from term to term and be different for different sections. See the Class Schedule for the specific topic being offered. 3 hours supervision. (008117) **Grade Basis:** Graded

Repeatability: You may take this course more than once **Course Attributes:** Upper Division

REAL 399 Special Problems

1-3 Units

Typically Offered: Fall and spring

This course is an independent study of special problems. You must register directly with a supervising faculty member. Students registering for this course should prepare a project proposal to be discussed with their faculty advisor before enrolling in the course. 9 hours supervision.
