## SPAN 101 Beginning Spanish I 4 Units GC, GE

**Prerequisite:** No credit for those who have two or more years of Spanish within the last three years.

**Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

Introduction to Spanish language and culture. Emphasis on the fundamental skills of understanding, speaking, reading, and writing Spanish. 2 hours activity, 3 hours discussion. (009113)

**General Education:** Humanities (3B)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 4 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division; Global Cultures Course

## SPAN 102 Beginning Spanish II 4 Units GC, GE

**Prerequisite:** SPAN 101 or equivalent.

**Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

Continuation of SPAN 101. Further development of student's cultural competence and proficiency in the fundamental skills of understanding, speaking, reading, and writing Spanish. 2 hours activity, 3 hours discussion. (009118)

**General Education:** Humanities (3B)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 4 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division; Global Cultures Course

## SPAN 189 Internship 1-3 Units

**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department

This course is an internship. You must register with a supervising faculty member. 0 hours supervision. (021406)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division

## SPAN 198 Special Topics 1-4 Units

**Prerequisite:** Department permission.

**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department

This course is for special topics. Typically the topic is offered on a one-time-only basis and may vary from term to term and be different for different sections. See the Class Schedule for the specific topic being offered. 3 hours supervision. (009135)

**Repeatability:** You may take this course more than once

## SPAN 199 Special Problems 1-3 Units

**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department

This course is an independent study of special problems. You must register directly with a supervising faculty member. 9 hours supervision. (020564)

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units

## SPAN 201 Intermediate Spanish I 4 Units GC, GE

**Prerequisite:** SPAN 102 or equivalent.

**Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

Reviewing and expanding of language skills and cultural concepts introduced in SPAN 101 and SPAN 102. Particular emphasis on the development of writing and reading proficiency. 2 hours activity, 3 hours discussion. (009121)

**General Education:** Humanities (3B)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 4 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division; Global Cultures Course

## SPAN 201B Intermediate Spanish for Business 4 Units GC, GE

**Prerequisite:** SPAN 102 or equivalent.

**Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

This course offers students the development and practice of Spanish language skills needed to communicate effectively and in a culturally sensitive manner with Spanish-speaking individuals in a variety of business situations and settings. Work includes oral practice, specialized vocabulary building activities, and a variety of projects to build linguistic and cultural competence. 2 hours activity, 3 hours discussion. (022468)

**General Education:** Humanities (3B)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 4 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division; Global Cultures Course

## SPAN 201C Intermediate Spanish for Healthcare 4 Units GC, GE

**Prerequisite:** SPAN 102 or equivalent.

**Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

This course offers students the development and practice of Spanish language skills needed in healthcare professions to communicate effectively and in a culturally sensitive manner with Spanish-speaking individuals. Work includes reading and composition, oral practice through role play, specialized vocabulary building activities, and a variety of projects to build linguistic and cultural competence. 2 hours activity, 3 hours discussion. (022196)

**General Education:** Humanities (3B)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 4 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division; Global Cultures Course

## SPAN 202 Intermediate Spanish II 4 Units GC, GE

**Prerequisite:** SPAN 201, SPAN 201C, or equivalent.

**Typically Offered:** Fall and spring

Reviewing and expanding of language skills and cultural concepts introduced in SPAN 101, SPAN 102, and SPAN 201. Particular emphasis on the development of writing and reading proficiency. 2 hours activity, 3 hours discussion. (009120)

**General Education:** Humanities (3B)

**Grade Basis:** Graded

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 4 units

**Course Attributes:** Lower Division; Global Cultures Course

<p><b>SPAN 202N Intermediate Spanish for Heritage Speakers</b>      <b>4 Units GC, GE</b></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> Faculty permission.  <b>Typically Offered:</b> Fall and spring</p> <p>This course reviews and builds upon the Spanish language skills that heritage speakers have already acquired through life experiences, providing the opportunity to develop reading and writing skills related to the use of Spanish in professional contexts. An important component of this course is to read and discuss historical and cultural texts that raise the students' awareness of Hispanic heritage in the U.S. and texts that allow them to reflect on their own personal experiences as part of that heritage. 2 hours activity, 3 hours discussion. (009126)</p> <p><b>General Education:</b> Humanities (3B)  <b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 4 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Lower Division; Global Cultures Course</p>	<p><b>SPAN 302 Written Spanish in Context</b>      <b>3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> SPAN 301.  <b>Typically Offered:</b> Fall and spring</p> <p>Development of reading strategies and the writing process as a continuation of composition studies begun in SPAN 301, with a special focus on fluency, precision in language, style, transitions, organization of various short essay types, and MLA formatting guidelines. This course serves as preparation for other upper division courses and any profession that includes writing or analytical thinking. 3 hours discussion. (009139)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Upper Division</p>
<p><b>SPAN 289 Internship</b>      <b>1-3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Typically Offered:</b> Inquire at department</p> <p>This course is an internship. You must register with a supervising faculty member. 9 hours supervision. (021020)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Lower Division</p>	<p><b>SPAN 303 Spoken Spanish in Context</b>      <b>3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> SPAN 202, SPAN 202N, or faculty permission. May be taken concurrently with SPAN 301 and/or SPAN 321.  <b>Typically Offered:</b> Fall and spring</p> <p>This course offers intensive practice in the spoken language at an advanced level of proficiency, particularly in more formal registers. Students participate in guided conversations and discussions, but the focus is on public discourse, such as debates and speeches. Special emphasis is placed on enrichment of vocabulary and development of rhetorical strategies. 3 hours discussion. (009153)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Upper Division</p>
<p><b>SPAN 298 Special Topics</b>      <b>1-3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Typically Offered:</b> Inquire at department</p> <p>3 hours seminar. (020148)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 99 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Lower Division</p>	<p><b>SPAN 303C Spoken Spanish in Professional Contexts</b>      <b>3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> SPAN 202, SPAN 202N, or faculty permission. May be taken concurrently with SPAN 301 and/or SPAN 320.  <b>Typically Offered:</b> Fall and spring</p> <p>This course offers continued development of oral communication skills geared towards the use of Spanish in professional careers. Through various modes of public discourse and guided interpersonal exchanges, students will enrich their vocabulary and develop rhetorical strategies rooted in real-world, practical forms of public speaking and oral communication. 3 hours discussion. (022321)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Upper Division</p>
<p><b>SPAN 299 Special Problems</b>      <b>1-3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> Faculty permission.  <b>Typically Offered:</b> Inquire at department</p> <p>This course is an independent study of special problems. (020962)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Credit/No Credit  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Lower Division</p>	<p><b>SPAN 320 Introduction to Spanish Linguistics</b>      <b>3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> SPAN 202 (or equivalent), SPAN 301 or SPAN 303 (may be taken concurrently).  <b>Typically Offered:</b> Spring only</p> <p>A survey of the fields of general linguistics. Theory and practice of language analysis. Relationship between language and culture. Principles of phonology, morphology, and syntax of Spanish language. 3 hours discussion. (009142)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Upper Division</p>
<p><b>SPAN 301 Advanced Spanish</b>      <b>3 Units</b></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> SPAN 202, SPAN 202N, or equivalent. May be taken concurrently with SPAN 321 and/or SPAN 303.  <b>Typically Offered:</b> Fall and spring</p> <p>Review of vocabulary and sentence structures that typically occur in common genres of writing in the Spanish language, with an emphasis on writing as a process and the development of self-correction strategies. 3 hours discussion. (009137)</p> <p><b>Grade Basis:</b> Graded  <b>Repeatability:</b> You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  <b>Course Attributes:</b> Upper Division</p>	

- SPAN 321 Spanish Phonetics and Phonology** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 202, SPAN 202N, or faculty permission. May be taken concurrently with SPAN 301 and/or SPAN 303.  
**Typically Offered:** Fall only  
 Introduction to the analysis of the Spanish sound system, both phonetics and phonology. Topics include, among others, the articulatory system, sound production, the classification of vowels and consonants, phonetic transcription, and the description and analysis of dialectal varieties of Spanish. 3 hours discussion. (009150)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 330 Pop Culture in the Hispanic World** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 202 or SPAN 202N or instructor permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 An interdisciplinary exploration of selected aspects of popular culture in Spanish-speaking regions of the world. Students analyze the ways in which pop culture contributes to the construction of identity and engages with contemporary issues such as globalization, social inequality, and environmental challenges. 3 hours discussion. (022651)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 331 Exploring Modern Spain** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301 or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Fall only  
 Introduction to the historical and cultural heritage of Spain, to selected figures in the arts and public life, and to the ways and traditions of Spaniards today. Readings, reports, and discussion. 3 hours discussion. (009152)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 332 Latin America Past and Present** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301 or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Spring only  
 A survey of the cultural, social, economic, and political heritage of Latin America and its evolution into contemporary society, with particular emphasis on Spanish-language materials that reflect how Latin American artists, activists, and intellectuals think about their own place in the world. 3 hours discussion. (009155)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 341 Literary Explorations of the Hispanic World** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301.  
**Typically Offered:** Fall only  
 Introduces students to the study of Hispanic literature and culture and develops their skills in the comprehension and analysis of prose, poetry, and drama. 3 hours discussion. (009140)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 398 Special Topics** **1-3 Units**  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 This course is for special topics. Typically the topic is offered on a one-time-only basis and may vary from term to term and be different for different sections. See the Class Schedule for the specific topic being offered. 1 hour lecture. (009157)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course more than once  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 399 Special Problems** **1-3 Units**  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 This course is an independent study of special problems. You must register directly with a supervising faculty member. 9 hours supervision. (009158)  
**Grade Basis:** Credit/No Credit  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 425 Spanish Teaching** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301, SPAN 320.  
**Typically Offered:** Fall only even years  
 This is a senior-level Spanish course that introduces students to current theories of second language acquisition and implications of key research for classroom practice. Students learn strategies for teaching Spanish, including the utilization of appropriate technology. In addition to lecture and discussion, students complete the Early Field Experience hours required for entry to a credential program. 3 hours clinical, 2 hours lecture. (020141)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 430 Creative Writing in Spanish** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 341, or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 This course gives students mentored experience in creative writing in Spanish. Students explore the conventions of selected literary genres and develop knowledge of rhetorical strategies and the skills needed to write in selected subgenres. Students produce original works, participate in critical commentary, and engage in iterative revision and editing. The course also includes public presentations of student work. 3 hours seminar. (022410)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 443 Hispanic Novel** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301; SPAN 341; or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 Analysis of representative novels from Latin America and Spain. 3 hours discussion. (009167)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division

- SPAN 450 Stories of Migration in the Hispanic World** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301; SPAN 330, SPAN 331, SPAN 332, or SPAN 341; or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 Exploration of stories and films in Spanish related to the movements of peoples in the Americas. Students examine literary and cultural manifestations of migration in Spanish-speaking regions of the world, including the journeys of the original inhabitants of the Americas, the migration of European colonizers, and modern tales of migration within the Americas. 3 hours discussion. (022711)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 451 Literature of Mexico** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301; SPAN 341; or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 Readings and reports on literature of Mexico from pre-Columbian to contemporary literature. 3 hours discussion. (009168)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 455 Indigenous Literature and Translation** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301; SPAN 341; or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 Introduction to literary translation through a close reading of contemporary Indigenous literatures from Latin America. Students explore topics such as translation theory, language revitalization, and self-translation and work on both analyzing and producing translations of literary texts. 3 hours discussion. (022320)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 461 Don Quixote** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301; SPAN 341; or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 Cervantes' novel and his amiable madman in the larger context of literature and culture. Commentary on contemporary history, society, and politics. 3 hours discussion. (009165)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 471 Women and Literature in the Hispanic World** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301; SPAN 341; or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 Women in Spanish-speaking society. An approach to culture via a study of women as literary subjects and as writers. The idealization and reality of their existence as reflected through Spanish and Latin American literature. 3 hours discussion. (009182)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 481 Film and Literature in the Hispanic World** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301; SPAN 341; or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 Students consider the elements that constitute literary and cinematic masterpieces by examining films based on a variety of texts: epic poetry, drama, short story, legend, novel, zarzuela, and film script. The films represent the cultural and linguistic diversity in areas of Spain and Latin America. 3 hours discussion. (009183)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 489 Direct Field Exper in Spanish** **1-3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** Recommended for majors and graduate students, some minors upon completion of SPAN 302 or equivalent or faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 This course is an internship. You must register directly with a supervising faculty member. Provides students with the opportunity to develop their language proficiency in Spanish and enables them to use their language skills in on-the-job situations. Limited to majors, graduate students, and selected minors upon completion of SPAN 302. A maximum of 3 units may be counted toward the major. 9 hours supervision. (009184)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 15 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 497 Spanish Culminating Experience** **3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** SPAN 301, SPAN 341, or faculty permission; senior standing, Spanish majors only.  
**Typically Offered:** Fall only  
 This senior seminar allows Spanish majors to assess and reflect on the knowledge and skills they have developed, applying them through projects focused on practical language use and current issues in the Spanish-speaking world. Students engage in activities that prepare them for professional opportunities while increasing their intercultural awareness. 3 hours discussion. (009156)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 3 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 498 Special Topics** **1-3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** Department permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 This course is for special topics. Typically the topic is offered on a one-time-only basis and may vary from term to term and be different for different sections. See the Class Schedule for the specific topic being offered. 1 hour seminar. (009186)  
**Grade Basis:** Graded  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course more than once  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division
- SPAN 499 Special Problems** **1-3 Units**  
**Prerequisite:** Faculty permission.  
**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department  
 This course is an independent study of special problems. You must register directly with a supervising faculty member. 3 hours supervision. (009187)  
**Grade Basis:** Credit/No Credit  
**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units  
**Course Attributes:** Upper Division

**SPAN 499H Spanish Honors Thesis 3 Units**

**Prerequisite:** Faculty permission.

**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department

Independent Study. Completion of Honors thesis under the direction of assigned Spanish faculty. The thesis requires original work beyond that normally required in undergraduate work. Students present the thesis in a public lecture. 9 hours supervision. (015815)

**SPAN 689 Internship 1-3 Units**

**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department

This course is an internship. You must register with a supervising faculty member. 9 hours supervision. (009196)

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units

**Course Attributes:** Graduate Division

**SPAN 697 Independent Study 1-3 Units**

**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department

This course is a graduate-level independent study offered for 1.0-3.0 units. You must register directly with a supervising faculty member. 3 hours supervision. (009199)

**Repeatability:** You may take this course for a maximum of 6 units

**SPAN 698 Special Topic 1-3 Units**

**Typically Offered:** Inquire at department

This course is a special topic offered for 1.0-3.0 units. Typically the topic is offered on a one-time-only basis and will vary from term to term and be different for different sections. 3 hours seminar. (009198)
